WHO IS COE?

The Office of Community Outreach and Engagement (COE) meaningfully engages the community in UNC Lineberger's research, clinical care, and programmatic and policy efforts to better understand and serve the population's needs. Infusing community perspectives helps ensure Lineberger's efforts are timely, relevant, and responsive to cancer patients and caregivers, community providers and public health practitioners, policy makers, and the public at large. Community engagement is a key priority for UNC Lineberger as a National Cancer Institute-designated cancer center.

WHAT CAN COE DO FOR ME?

Our team can advise on topics such as health literacy, how to engage patients and community organizations, and cultural sensitivity & humility in working with populations disproportionately affected by cancer. Some frequent requests our office receives include:

- Providing data on current cancer burden in North Carolina and beyond
- Giving guidance in the formation of a community advisory board (CAB)
- Receiving assistance from UNC Lineberger's CAB
- Providing technical assistance on how to create a community-engaged research proposal
- Matching researchers with patient advocates and community partners
- Connecting researchers with each other




