2016 End of Year Report UNC Cancer Network

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Overview

2016 was a busy and productive year for the UNC Cancer Network Telehealth Team. This document highlights some of the many accomplishments of the group, as well as opportunities for additional expansion.

Lectures

The UNC Cancer Network has four separate oncology lecture series. Each lecture includes a live speaker (or speakers), and prepared slides. Each lecture has opportunities for audience participation via Web browsers and mobile phones, through a mechanism called Poll Everywhere. All lectures are available to UNCCN Telehealth Sites, as well as via WebEx, GoToWebinar, and live streaming. All lectures are recorded, and can be viewed in our Telehealth Lecture Library (which contains over 180 lectures) or on our YouTube site. Marketing of lectures is done via Web sites, The UNC Cancer Network monthly newsletter, emails, LMS, Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, and posters.

Multidisciplinary Tumor Boards

Each multidisciplinary tumor board is scheduled and monitored to include qualified remote participants. Every lecture is remotely monitored to make sure that all attendees connect correctly. A UNCCN team member watches each lecture, and handles all remote switching to ensure that the correct imaging is sent to remote participants. Frequent troubleshooting is necessary, due to the age of the equipment in the N.C. Cancer Hospital conference rooms.

Lay Navigation

- Collaboration with UNC Hospital to develop a Lay Navigation program that currently has over 50 volunteers that are involved in disease-specific outpatient and inpatient work.
- Development of this Lay Navigation model into a network of sites around the state leading to a Duke Endowment funding application that received initially positive feedback; final funding decision is pending.
- Tele-education network programs will be used to provide training for the multiple network Lay Navigation sites is part of the Duke Endowment application.
- Discussion with several pharma companies to extend this Lay Navigation model to a national program.
