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Overview

Despite the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the UNC Lineberger Cancer Network (UNCLCN) Telehealth Team has managed to continue to increase its ability to provide continuing education credits throughout North Carolina (and beyond) with our Telehealth webinar series, to maintain the number of tumor boards that we monitor, and to expand the number of university courses that we create through a partnership between Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center, NC A&T, and NC Central University.

Telehealth Webinars

The UNC Lineberger Cancer Network has four separate professional oncology webinar series. Each webinar includes a live speaker (or speakers), and prepared slides. These webinars provide opportunities for audience participation via Web browsers and mobile phones, through a mechanism called Poll Everywhere. All webinars are available to UNCLCN Telehealth Sites, as well as via Zoom Webinar and MediaSite live streaming. Every webinar is recorded and can be viewed in our Telehealth Webinar Library (which contains over 180 webinars) or on our YouTube site.

Publicity of webinars is done via web sites, the UNC Lineberger Cancer Network's monthly newsletter *Behind the Scenes*, emails, our Learning Portal, Facebook, LinkedIn, YouTube, Twitter, and flyers.

Moreover, we take the webinar recordings, create an assessment, and provide these self-paced, online courses in our Learning Portal to augment the ways in which healthcare professionals can improve their knowledge regarding cancer research and patient care and earn continuing education credits to keep their licenses current. Each course resides in the Learning Portal as a Self-Paced, Online Course for one year, and then is turned into a Non-Credit course once the accreditation runs out.

The **Advanced Practice Provider** series was created and is coordinated by Tammy Triglianos, DNP, ANP-BC, AOCNP, in partnership with the UNC Lineberger Cancer Network.

The Southeastern American Indian Cancer health Equity Partnership (SAICEP) is a unique collaboration initiated by the Community Outreach and Engagement teams at the NCI Comprehensive Cancer Centers at Duke, UNC Lineberger and Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist, with a focus on understanding and addressing the cancer-related health needs of American Indian communities in our catchment areas and beyond. The partnership offers culturally competent research, education and community engagement for American Indian tribal communities. Tribal and community organizations and leaders, as well as clinical and academic institutions are encouraged to be a part of our efforts.

NC Community College Oncology Webinars

University Courses in Collaboration with UNC Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center, NC A&T, and NC Central University

Beginning in 2020, the UNC Lineberger Cancer Network began collaborative efforts with UNC Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center, North Carolina A&T, North Carolina Central University to develop courses for students at all three institutions. These courses allowed us to draw on the knowledge and expertise of instructors at a couple of the states Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) as well as at Lineberger. We hope to expand these courses to other HBCUs as well.

Multidisciplinary Tumor Boards

Each multidisciplinary tumor board is scheduled and monitored to include qualified remote participants and to ensure that all attendees connect correctly. During the pandemic, all tumor boards went virtual, and UNCLCN facilitated this transition. As tumor boards test hybrid attendance, a UNCLCN team member is in the room to handle all remote switching to make certain that the correct images are sent to remote participants. Frequent troubleshooting is necessary, due to the age of the equipment in the NC Cancer Hospital conference rooms.

Highlights of 2021-22

Learning Portal

In 2017, UNCLCN put together our Learning Portal (learn.unclcn.org), where we house our Self-Paced, Online Courses. In 2021, we moved our Learning Portal to a new LMS, where we house our Live Telehealth webinars; Self-Paced, Online Courses; Non-Credit Courses; Community College Oncology; Introduction to the Pathology of Disease; Exploring Cancer; Oncology Clinical Trials; Hematology and Oncology Resident Training; and Investigator Initiated Trials.

Self-Paced, Online Courses

With each of our Telehealth webinars (Patient Centered Care, Advanced Practice Provider, Research to Practice, and Southeastern American Indian Cancer Health Equity Partnership), we take each live webinar's video recording, create an assessment, and acquire continuing education accreditation from several organizations. The Learning Portal allows healthcare professionals to earn continuing education credits at any time that is convenient for them.

Continuing Education Credits

UNCLCN has provided several types of continuing education credits for healthcare professionals: CME for physicians, NCPD/CNE for nurses, ACPE for pharmacists and pharmacy techs, and ASRT for radiation technologists. In late 2022, we added CTR for cancer registrars and are reaching out to registrars throughout North Carolina to inform them of these opportunities.

In 2020, UNCLCN's website was redesigned to provide greater navigability for our users. Overall, the site is more visually appealing and easier to use.

UNCLCN continues to use Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn to connect with potential attendees. We continue to refine our social media message and increase our number of followers on all three platforms so as to improve our attendance numbers on the Telehealth and Community College Oncology webinar series.
