



Statistics and Health Disparities **Current Statistics (SEER Data)** Health Disparities (Samaan et al., 2023) · Higher incidence and mortality rate Estimated new cases 64,050 Estimated deaths 50,550 among Black compared to White persons • Disproportionate burden of disease in 5-Year relative survival rate is 12.5% young women of color 44% localized progression 16% regional progression • Incidence is increasing at a faster rate in young women (<55 years) than young 3% distant progression 10% unknown progression Among young women (<55 years), Hispanic and Black women experienced a disproportionately greater increase in


